What Do You Need to Complete the FAFSA?

- Student and parent(s)' driver's license number(s)
- Student and parent(s)' social security number(s)
- (Alien registration number if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- Parent(s)' date(s) of birth
- Parent(s)' federal income tax return from 2 years ago (if filed)
- Student's federal income tax return from 2 years ago (if filed)
- Parent/student income information (if tax return was not filed)
- Your current bank statements
- Student & parent FSA ID (username & password). If you have lost your information, visit <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>

Your Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID)

Creating an FSA ID is the first step to completing your FAFSA. Your FSA ID serves as your legal signature when completing the FAFSA. Create an FSA ID using your own personal information and for your own use.

To create your FSA ID, go to <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>. This information should be kept confidential and stored in a safe place; you will need this every year when you file your FAFSA.
