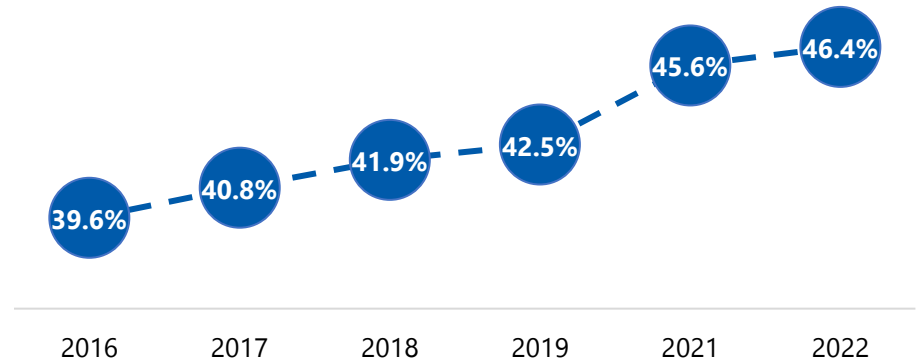

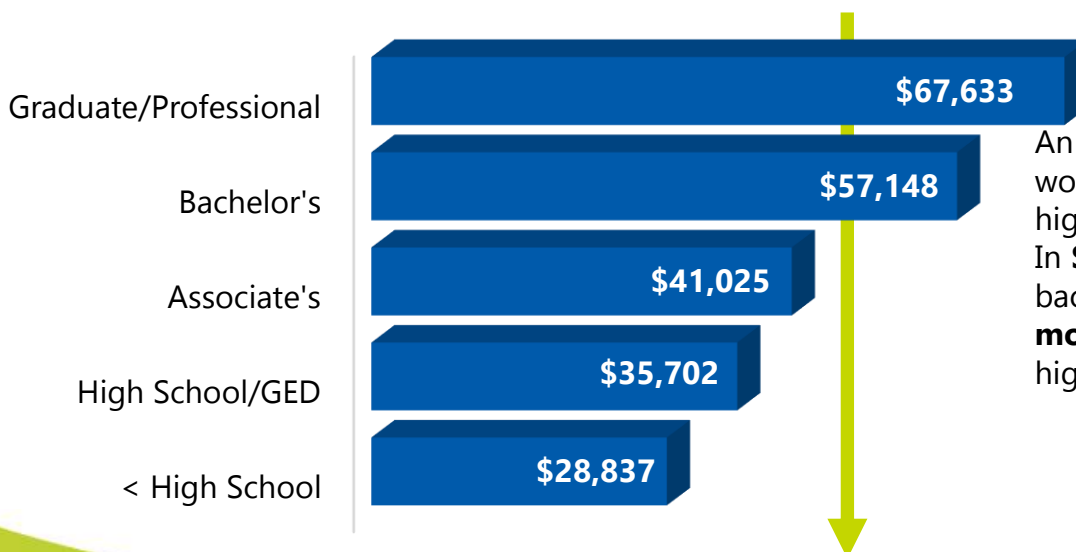

### Median Earnings by Education/Training Level



An annual dividend is paid to workers with education beyond a high school diploma or equivalency. In **Sarasota** County, a worker with a bachelor's degree earns **20.1% more per year** than a worker with a high school education.
